Ausfilm supports international film and TV makers and studios to find what they need in Australia to bring their stories to life. Ausfilm connects film and TV makers to Australian crew, talent and screen service businesses like sound stages; post-production and visual effects studios; taxation support, visa, production and legal services; and travel and freight companies.

Ausfilm markets the Australian Government's Screen Production Incentive scheme comprising the Location Offset, PDV (post, digital and visual effects) Offset and Producer Offset. We also market state government tax incentives and grants.

Ausfilm is a unique partnership between private industry and government. The partnership comprises Australia's screen agencies within federal and state governments, five major studio complexes, production service providers and leading picture post, visual effects and sound and music studios.

Ausfilm's head office is based in Sydney and its USA office is in Los Angeles.

Screen Australia administers the Producer Offset and Australia's Official Co-production program. It is the lead Australian Government agency responsible for supporting the development, production, promotion and distribution of Australian screen content in all its forms, across all platforms.

SERVICES PROVIDED TO FILMMAKERS

Screen Australia develops Australian voices by supporting screen practitioners to expand their skills, grow their businesses, and increase their international networks, ensuring our industry remains globally competitive. The agency invests directly in Australian feature films, documentaries, TV drama, children's content, online series, First Nations content and games. Additionally, the agency provides authoritative and relevant data and research to both the industry and government.

THE PRODUCER OFFSET

The Producer Offset is a refundable tax offset (rebate) for Australian films. To be regarded as an Australian film, the project must demonstrate it contains Significant Australian Content (SAC) or be an Official Co-production.

The Producer Offset is paid after a project is completed and Screen Australia has issued the production company with a Final Certificate.

The amount of the Offset is determined as a percentage of the Qualifying Australian Production Expenditure (QAPE). It is:

- 40% of QAPE incurred on theatrical feature films
- 30% of QAPE incurred on other eligible formats (for example, series or single episode programs made for TV, SVOD or online, documentary series and short-form animations)

Broadly speaking, QAPE is expenditure incurred on goods and services provided in Australia for the making of the film.

ELIGIBILITY: To be eligible for the Producer Offset, a film or program must:

- Be completed
- Have Significant Australian Content (SAC) or be an Official Co-production
- Be an eligible format
- Have QAPE that meets or exceeds the relevant threshold
- Be made by an applicant company which is an Australian company, or a foreign company with an Australian permanent residency and an Australian Business Number (ABN).

Screen Australia determines whether a film has SAC based on published guidelines which have regard to:

- The subject matter of the film
- The place where the film was made
- The nationalities and places of residence of the people who took part in making it
- The details of production expenditure incurred
- Any other matters that Screen Australia considers to be relevant, including the extent to which Australian producers and key creatives have a share in the copyright, profit and recoupment for the film.

OFFICIAL CO-PRODUCTIONS

Official Co-productions do not need to meet the SAC test to access the Producer Offset.

Australia currently has treaties in force with Canada, China, Germany, India, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Korea, Malaysia, Singapore, South Africa, the United Kingdom and Memoranda of Understandings with France and New Zealand.

These agreements set out the parameters for how two or more co-producers can make an eligible co-production, including the minimum financial and creative contributions. These agreements and the Screen Australia co-production guidelines are available on the Screen Australia website.

Screen NSW, based in Sydney, New South Wales, is the State Government's funding body for the screen and digital games industries.

The organisation aims to assist, promote, and strengthen the NSW screen sector by delivering funding and support programs that attract investment, innovation, and employment opportunities to the state.

Screen NSW offers competitive incentives to attract international footloose productions, post-production, and digital games to the state.

Screen NSW also provides location and production liaison services, including facilitating international inbounds to NSW. Financial support for location scouts and inbounds may be available through the Location Scouts and Inbound Program.

Local filmmakers and Official Treaty Co-productions can apply for early development, advanced development, or production finance support for projects ready to go into production. Regional Filming Fund grants are available to support local productions that film on location in regional NSW for a minimum of five shooting days.

Designated a UNESCO City of Film, Sydney is a globally respected production, post-production, and digital games centre with nearly 60% of all Australian crew.

MADE IN NSW – INTERNATIONAL FOOTLOOSE PRODUCTION

The Made in NSW fund supports the advancement of NSW as a production destination for feature films and major television drama programs. The level of financial assistance offered is determined on a case-by-case basis. This incentive can be combined with the Australian Government's Location Offset, PDV Offset and the Producer Offset.

ELIGIBILITY: Projects must be footloose. Eligible projects include:

- Feature films, telemovies, animation, mini-series, and TV drama series
- International/Australian co-productions
- Fully internationally financed features and TV projects from local production companies

NSW POST, DIGITAL AND VISUAL EFFECTS (PDV) REBATE

The NSW Post, Digital and Visual Effects (PDV) Rebate offers eligible productions a 10% rebate on qualifying NSW PDV expenditure related to PDV work carried out in NSW. The rebate can be combined with Australian Government incentives.

ELIGIBILITY: An applicant must spend at least AU\$500,000 on PDV in New South Wales.

Eligible formats are:

- Feature films (drama, documentary, animation)
- TV drama, animation, comedy and documentary (telemovies, mini-series and series).

Applicants must register the project with Screen NSW prior to the commencement of PDV work for which the rebate is sought.

NSW DIGITAL GAMES REBATE

The NSW Digital Games Rebate offers eligible productions a 10% Rebate on qualifying NSW digital games expenditure related to digital games work carried out in NSW. The rebate can be combined with Australian Government incentives..

ELIGIBILITY: An applicant must spend at least AU\$350,000 on the development of a digital game in New South Wales.

Applicants must register the project with Screen NSW prior to the commencement of digital games work for which the rebate is sought.

LOCATION SCOUTS AND INBOUND PROGRAM

This program offers eligible productions assistance for location surveys and may include covering some of the costs associated with on-ground travel, including accommodation, domestic flights, vehicle hire and location manager services.

In addition to working with Ausfilm to facilitate international inbounds, direct enquiries to Screen NSW are also welcome.

ELIGIBILITY: Eligible projects include feature films, telemovies, mini-series, TV series, and pilots.

The program is open to projects prior to commencement of pre-production and prior to/or during financing.

Screen Queensland is the state government agency dedicated to growing a successful screen production industry, and its competitive financial incentives are matched by a winning combination of internationally renowned crew, diverse locations, and world-class studios and post-production facilities.

The state's studio network extends from the south-east corner to tropical Far North Queensland and includes the Screen Queensland Studios in both Brisbane and Cairns and the Gold Coast's Village Roadshow Studios. All studios are located close to international airports, with direct flights available from the US to Brisbane.

Queensland's studios are also convenient to versatile and accessible locations. The sunshine state boasts some of Australia's most enviable white beaches, tropical rainforests, deserts, swamps, green meadows, dry grassland, sleepy towns, cosmopolitan cityscapes, and contemporary and historical architecture.

Screen Queensland offers a bespoke, concierge service. Staffed by highly knowledgeable and experienced screen professionals, Screen Queensland provides expertise and assistance across incentives, physical production, locations and marketing — working hand-in-hand with productions from point of initial enquiry through to acquittal.

The agency offers:

- physical production liaison
- advice on state and federal incentives and co-production ventures
- advice on local crew recruitment
- location breakdowns and scouting assistance
- tonal and bespoke location packages
- liaison with local government authorities and councils
- Brisbane and Cairns studio access for filming and production services.

PRODUCTION ATTRACTION INCENTIVE

The Queensland Government via Screen Queensland offers a Production Attraction incentive for productions with a minimum spend of AU\$3.5 million within the state. A further incentive is available from the City of Gold Coast to productions that spend a minimum of AU\$750,000 in the region. These incentives

can be used in conjunction with the Australian Government's Location Offset, Producer Offset and PDV Offset.

POST, DIGITAL AND VISUAL EFFECTS (PDV) INCENTIVE

Screen Queensland's 15% PDV incentive is the most competitive on the eastern coast of Australia. It is available to productions that use Queensland post-production services with a minimum spend of AU\$250,000 on PDV elements completed in the state. The incentive can be used in conjunction with the federal government's offset.

STATE PAYROLL TAX REBATE

Available to productions that have paid the 4.75 to 4.95% Queensland Payroll Tax, with a minimum spend of AU\$3.5 million in the state.

REVOLVING FILM FINANCING FUND (RFFF)

Provides secured loans to cash-flow the Producer Offset, distribution guarantees and pre-sales. The applicable interest rate is half (50%) the 90-day Bank Bill Swap Rate with a flat 5.5% Administration and Legal fee making it an extremely competitive option.

STUDIOS IN QUEENSLAND

- Screen Queensland Studios, Brisbane has two air-conditioned sound stages both 32,291 sq ft x 32.6ft h (3,000 m2 x 7m h)
- Screen Queensland Studios, Cairns has one brand new air-conditioned sound stage – 11,517sq ft (1,070 m2)
- Village Roadshow Studios offers nine sound stages up to 262 x 154 x 59 ft (80 x 47 x 18m) and three purpose-built water tanks, including the largest in Australia.

Screen Tasmania provides grants and equity investments for the development and production of screen projects in Tasmania including web series, drama, documentaries, feature films, TV series and games.

Screen Tasmania offers a range of services to the screen industry, such as: grants and equity investments in the development and production of screen projects, including drama, documentaries, feature films, short-form and long-form series, and games professional and industry development support for Tasmanian practitioners.

ISLAND SCREEN INCENTIVE

The Island Screen Incentive provides a one-off grant at the rate of 10% of the expenditure on Tasmanian goods and services while producing the project, capped at AU\$500,000 (excluding GST) per project. Applications can be considered at any time, but in all cases must be lodged at least four weeks before pre-production commences. Applications are not assessed in a competitive way, but all applications are subject to the availability of funds.

ELIGIBILITY: The applicant must meet Screen Tasmania's general eligibility criteria, and must be an Australian company, which is the company that incurs expenditure on producing the project.

Projects must:

- be a live action screen production
- be either factual (including documentary and reality) or scripted
- be a feature film (60-minute minimum) or a series with at least 30-minute episodes
- expend at least AU\$1.5 million as Tasmanian spend
- be substantially based in Tasmania (i.e. minimum 10 days' filming); and
- have marketplace attachment to secure public release.

Projects must not be:

- advertising or substantially brand-funded
- entirely animated
- corporate; or
- purely educative.

The applicant and production must display a demonstrated commitment to training Tasmanian screen practitioners, such as by providing placements for entry-level crews, or by promoting Tasmanian crew to a higher level than they have otherwise worked. This contribution is at the production's expense, but will be negotiated by Screen Tasmania. Screen Tasmania must be satisfied that the budget and finance plan is – or will be – secure. This will be determined on a case-by-case basis.

Screen Tasmania reserves the right not to approve an application if the applicant or its principals are not considered fit and proper, or where the funds are not available to meet the applied amount. In the latter case, the amount of funding approved may be reduced depending on the funds available.

PRODUCTION SUPPORT

This support can be in the form of a recoupable equity production investment or a non-recoupable grant, depending on the amount provided and/or the type of program you apply for, such as Production Equity Support for equity and the Island Screen Incentive program for grants.

ELIGIBILITY: Eligibility is considered on a case-by-case basis, taking into account the engagement of resident Tasmanian screen practitioners, and/or the creation of infrastructure and supplementary employment.

The amount of funds invested is usually determined by the amount of eligible Tasmanian expenditure within the state. The primary criterion for assessment is the extent to which production investment provides economic benefits, job creation and career development for Tasmanian cast and crew.

Screen Territory is the Northern Territory (NT) Government's screen industry agency responsible for supporting and developing the film, TV and digital media industries within the Territory.

Screen Territory offers a range of incentives and services to the screen industry:

- Funding and production incentives
- Location scouting
- Liaison and location permit support
- Sourcing crew and facilities
- Facilitation of engagement to other NT governmental agencies (including tourism)
- Further production incentives available on a case-by-case basis, based on economic benefit.

PRODUCTION ATTRACTION INCENTIVE PROGRAM

Screen Territory will contribute to production finance of screen projects in order to build the capacity of the Territory screen industry as well as raise the profile of the Territory and increase its level of screen production.

ELIGIBILITY: Incentives are determined on the economic, industry, tourism and community benefits a production will bring to the Territory including spend, jobs, technical and infrastructure legacies.

This incentive program is open to all Australian and international producers, production companies and studios with screen projects that:

- Spend a minimum of AU\$2 million on qualifying Northern Territory Production Expenditure in the Northern Territory (exceptions may be considered in prior discussion with Screen Territory)
- Are footloose (i.e. are international or Australian productions that are not already locked into production in the Northern Territory)
- Provide evidence of genuine marketplace interest for commercial release or distribution
- Engage screen industry practitioners in meaningful employment, including attachments, who are Northern Territory residents as per the definition in the Screen Territory Terms of Trade

The following formats are eligible to receive a Production Attraction Incentive:

- Fiction feature film or series
- Documentary feature film or series

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN POST-PRODUCTION, DIGITAL & VISUAL EFFECTS INCENTIVE (WA PDV INCENTIVE)

The WA PDV Incentive is Australia's most competitive PDV incentive.

It is calculated at 20% of the Qualifying Western Australian Post-Production Expenditure and has Australia's lowest minimum spend threshold of AU\$100,000.

The WA PDV incentive can be combined with Screenwest's Scripted and Documentary Production Funds and the Western Australian Regional Screen Fund. It also complements the Australian Government's Producer Offset, Location Offset and PDV Offset streams.

The WA PDV Incentive is effective 1 July 2025 onwards.

SCREEN PRODUCTION FUND

Production funding for scripted and unscripted content for any screen that generates significant economic outcomes for the South Australian screen industry.

ELIGIBILITY: For projects produced substantially in South Australia, producers can receive up to 10% of South Australian production spend.

POST-PRODUCTION, DIGITAL AND VISUAL EFFECTS REBATE (SA PDV REBATE)

A rebate equivalent to 10% of expenditure on post-production, digital and VFX work undertaken in South Australia on eligible projects.

ELIGIBILITY: A minimum qualifying expenditure on qualifying tasks of AU\$250,000 must be spent in South Australia on post-production, digital and VFX.

PAYROLL TAX EXEMPTION

The South Australian Government offers a payroll tax exemption to producers shooting feature films in South Australia. The incentive may reduce a project's total payroll liability by up to 4.95%.

ELIGIBILITY: This incentive is available to production companies that make feature films in South Australia and incur a South Australian payroll tax liability.

VIDEO GAME DEVELOPMENT REBATE (SA VGD REBATE)

A rebate equivalent to 10% of expenditure on video game development work undertaken in South Australia on eligible projects.

ELIGIBILITY: A minimum qualifying expenditure on qualifying tasks of AU\$250,000 must be spent in South Australia on video game development work.
